REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY

As we know, Remembrance Sunday this year is going to be very different due to Covid 19 restrictions. The City Council is not organising a large parade as in previous years but is providing a framework for remembrance on this solemn occasion.

We ask that people strongly consider remembering from home this year and after the Two Minute Silence to show their appreciation for all those who served their country and especially who made the supreme sacrifice. If you intend to come to the War Memorial at Litten Gardens to pay your respects or to lay a wreath on Remembrance Sunday, please consider doing this throughout the day and not just at 11 am. The Mayor and a representative of the Lord Lieutenant will be laying a wreath after the Two Minute Silence at 11 am and a short and simple act of remembrance will take place. Any music played will be prerecorded and there cannot be any singing.

Later in the day, the City Council will be publishing a video containing a pre-recording of the **full** service of remembrance, including recollections by veterans and appropriate music. Please do check out the City Council's website for this www.chichestercity.gov.uk.

Please note that some live filming will take place on the day. We ask that you respect social distancing and allow the commemoration and the filming to proceed without interruption

Walk-in Covid testing site in Chichester

The new NHS Test and Trace walk-in test site is now operating in Northgate car park, Chichester. Please be aware that this is available on an appointment- only basis. The majority of the car park is open to commuters, residents and visitors as usual. Testing is available to anyone with coronavirus symptoms and you can book a test by visiting www.nhs.uk/coronavirus or by calling 119.

Self-isolation payments from CDC

If you are on a low income and have been instructed to self-isolate by NHS Test and Trace since 28 September, you may be eligible for a self-isolation payment of £500. To help stop the spread of coronavirus, people across England are now required by law to self-isolate if they test positive for the virus, or if they are instructed to self-isolate by NHS Test and Trace. The self-isolation support payments are there to help people on low incomes and to encourage people to self-isolate if instructed. We are processing applications and issuing these payments on behalf of the Government. To find out if you are eligible please see https://www.chichester.gov.uk/testandtracepayments

Claim tax back for working from home because of Covid

If you have been asked to work from home because of coronavirus then you can claim tax back on this. You cannot claim if you choose to work from home. You'll get tax relief based on the rate at which you pay tax. Find out more at https://www.gov.uk/tax-relief-for-employees/working-at-home

Community Speed Indicator Device (SID) - we need your support now!

Background

Some residents will recall WGRA's ongoing attempts to tackle speeding - our Westgate Action Week in 2019, our Community Speedwatch using a hand-held speed gun, and our previous work to try and get our own Speed Indicator Device (SID) on Westgate's lampposts.

Regarding our SID ambitions - West Sussex County Council Highways (WSCC) was not supportive - in part as there has been no fatality on our road(!) and their view that the impact of SIDs is diminished if there are too many in an area. However, WSCC agreed to a SID in Fishbourne village (which you may have seen) and has now agreed to work with the City Council and local communities on agreeing to two roving devices in the City. WGRA cannot go it alone, so our best chance of getting a SID on Westgate is the following.....please act now if you can.

Proposal

Our committee is supporting an initiative led by Parklands Residents' Association: to work with the City Council to purchase two SIDs for Chichester City, that different neighbourhoods, and streets, can use and rotate as required. We do not have to raise all of the cost (up to £5000) nor have all the hassle of coordinating volunteers to move it around, change batteries etc. Westgate could expect to have a SID about every 6 months for a fortnight.

Good news so far....

The City Council and their Finance Committee agreed last week to fund one SID in full. The other SID needs to be funded by the community. Further support is available from the WSCC Local Committee which meets in November. It has funding for community-backed applications which need to include evidence of public support.

How do Westgate residents pledge to support?

A Spacehive online crowd-funding page has therefore been launched and is collecting pledges from the public. Using Spacehive is a secure way to pitch your support for the SID to WSCC. All you need to do is register on the Spacehive site and make a small pledge (between £2 and £10) which will demonstrate your support for the project. Lots of small pledges are more powerful than a few big ones. For the price of a coffee, you can lend your support to get these SIDs up and running around central Chichester!

If you think this is a good idea, please act now – the initial deadline is Friday 6 November. The Spacehive page will remain open until 2nd December when the project will either be funded or not but our early response is key.

Register at https://www.spacehive.com/community-safety-drive---chichester and make your pledge by creating a one-off direct debit with Go Cardless (it takes 2 minutes, no one sees your bank details, it is secure etc) Donations will only be taken from your account when a fundraiser either meets its target or not. ie December

Please pledge – the community must show its support and lots of small backers will count for more than a few bigger donations and hopefully WSCC will make up the difference.

Community Speedwatch - Message from David Thornley


As mentioned above we have previously had a Community Speedwatch group setup in conjunction with the Police to identify speeding drivers. There's nothing like a few yellow jackets with a radar speed monitor to deter excessive speed!

The way it works is that we identify speeding drivers who are then sent a warning letter by the Police, if they persist the Police take further action. It's been very successful in Sussex and is now being rolled out nationwide. I should add that this complements the Speed Indicating Devices (see above) that advise drivers of their speed.

I'm rebuilding the team of operators after their activities lapsed over the past year and would appreciate some help. I need more volunteers willing to spend an hour or two once a month operating the device in pairs. A regular presence is needed to have a lasting effect. It's not onerous, you do have to learn how the scheme works but there's a good on-line learning facility. It only takes a couple of hours to pass the test and be qualified as an operator.

'The Livestock Markets of Chichester' commemorates Chichester's history as a market town, and will open at the **Novium Museum** on Saturday, 24 October 2020, exactly 30 years since the Chichester livestock market closed.

Chichester has been a centre for trade since the Roman period. Livestock sales were held in the streets of Chichester from medieval times onwards. In 1872 Chichester Cattle Market opened near Eastgate Square and livestock sales were transferred there. Market day sales soon grew in importance and by 1900 Chichester Market was described as 'the largest in the South of England'. It was not until the 1980s that the future of Chichester Cattle Market became uncertain, following a decline in its trade and debate about the future of the market site. The last livestock market in Chichester was held on 24 October 1990.

If you haven't already done so, please also consider downloading the NHS Covid-19 contact tracing app. It's the fastest way of knowing when you are at risk of coronavirus. The quicker you know, the quicker you can alert your loved ones, and your community. The more people that sign up to the app, the better we can control coronavirus. The app also provides you with a symptom checker, which helps you to determine if you need a test. If you do, it then gives you the option to book one. The app is free to download from the App Store and Google Play.
