#### PAVEMENT WORKS, WESTGATE - UPDATE

This work to redo the pavements on the Western end of Westgate is still underway but by way of an update, there had been some concerns from residents about the finish of the new pavements





and also the inconsistency of some of the work along a few of the driveways. The line of some driveways has ended up very angular in some places, with an edge to the new tarmac which is potentially uneven and the resulting look up the street is not entirely aesthetic!

One of our committee members has been in touch with West Sussex Highways to check on this and had a helpful reply. They have confirmed that in situations like this, the surface should be finished at a straight line across the driveway, wall to wall. Where the team have to follow joints in the old tarmac, they cannot lay the tarmac onto a dirt base e.g. gravel. However, all agree that the pavements should be an even width and these anomalies addressed, so West Sussex have committed to rectify this, if necessary, by returning to lay a solid base on which to lay the tarmac across the affected driveways. This work will probably be tied in with the next phase of work in the area in Sherborne Road in July, but they have committed to achieving straight lines across the driveways wherever possible.

Regarding the finish of the surface itself, the tarmac material used is apparently unusual in that, when first laid, it does take some time to "bed in" and reach its final state. When first laid, it is rough, soft, and has a very dark colour. These features will however improve with time and use, and the surface should smooth out, harden, and lighten in colour. Given the summer weather and the relatively large number of pedestrians, for most areas this should take about 1 to 3 months apparently.

Given the softness of the new surface when first laid, it is prone to marks like tyre marks and animal paw prints. We are told that most of these marks should lessen as the material beds in and the surface is used, and any surface damage should not impact the safety or longevity of the surface. If there is any damage or graffiti, this can be reported and repaired.

#### **Community Speedwatch Update**

With the relaxation of lockdown measures there has been a noticeable increase in traffic along Westgate, and not surprisingly, instances of excessive speed. Fortunately, we've now resumed the Community Speedwatch monitoring sessions that have such a noticeable effect on speeding drivers.



We held several sessions in May which made it clear that we want motorists to stick to the 20mph limit. On each occasion several drivers were reported to the Police as they were well over the limit and will receive warning letters.

To be able to hold more sessions we really do need some more volunteers to act as operators. A regular presence sends a clear message to drivers to slow down which is what everyone wants to happen. It's not onerous, an hour or so a month makes a great deal of difference. The training is straightforward and the reception we get from pedestrians helps to make it worthwhile.
