#### **More Road Matters!**

#### Twenty is Plenty City-wide!

You may have picked up on the *Chichester Observer* website (hopefully to be reported in the next edition of the newspaper itself) that Chichester City Council at their meeting last week on 23 February 2022 voted unanimously to ask WSCC Highways to implement a city-wide 20-mph speed limit.

Interestingly, apparently, a city-wide scheme is much easier for Police to enforce than a scheme where roads have different speed limits in the same urban area. WSCC agreed at their most recent meeting to look at the whole issue of speed limits in urban areas across the county.

We are not alone. Different parish councils across the county are urging their District Councils and WSCC to introduce a 20-mph speed limit in their communities and next week the District Council will be debating a similar motion. You will also know that the devolved Welsh Government recently agreed that a 20-mph speed limit should be introduced across Wales in built-up areas.

Sadly, if you are hit by a vehicle travelling at 40 mph you will probably die. Hit by a vehicle at 30 mph, you have a 90% chance of dying and a child is three times more likely to die. If you are hit at 20 mph only 10% will die. It really is a no brainer!

#### WGRA on the air waves!

Shared footpaths! Thanks to the persistence of Julia Smith, a WGRA Committee member, WGRA got good coverage in a full story in the *Chichester Observer* two weeks ago on the vexed question of proposed shared footpaths at the Sherborne Road and Westgate roundabout, including a picture on the front page!

Actually, the picture was taken on New Year's Day 2022 when several local residents (lurking at the back of the image) joined forces with a cohort of cyclists from ChiCycle and the Chichester District Cycle Forum to protest about the whole notion of shared pavements on a very constricted site. The full story was reported inside the paper where we reiterated our complaint that cyclists on pavements pose a real danger to pedestrians and whilst we welcomed new crossings at this junction, the numbers of bikes, elderly residents and Bishop Luffa pupils who converge on this roundabout is a potential recipe for disaster.

Government guidance on shared pavements has changed a lot in the last 6-12 months and they are not advised in urban areas, so WGRA had suggested that the shared path element of the design be held back and



commuted into the later phase, given that the Southern Access Road design feels imminent now and will change things again. WGRA will be pushing hard that shared pavements are not an acceptable solution for the next phase of changes, and that any new junction design must provide safe, segregated cycling on-road with proper traffic calming and traffic reduction on Westgate.

This newspaper article fed coincidentally into a feature by BBC Radio Sussex all about shared pavements across the county, and Julia developed these points and WGRA's concerns in a live interview on Friday 18 February. Another interview was conducted with Mark Record of ChiCycle who, as previously reported, had even instructed solicitors on his own account to seek judicial review of the shared pavement proposals but had had to drop his case because of rising legal costs.

## **Fouling on Westgate Pavements**

The problem continues but the District Council cleaning teams are now making daily inspections of the pavements on both sides of the road.
