WGRA Committee Update from Sarah Quail

As your newly elected District Councillor, I have been appointed to Chichester District Council's (CDC's) Planning Committee and must therefore stand down as Chair of both the City Council's Planning Committee and as Chair of the Westgate Residents Association (WGRA). As and when the White House Farm (WHF) Phase 2 Planning Application is discussed at CDC's Planning Committee, I shall probably be obliged not to vote (as CDC is more than aware that I have opposed – pre-determined - the proposals for the Southern Access Road (SAR) at City Council meetings) but I shall be able to speak on behalf of local residents.

As for the City Council, I must not be seen to be pre-determining any planning issues, all of which come to the City Council as a consultee before they are discussed by the Planning Authority which is Chichester District Council. At today's meeting of CDC's Planning Committee, I was obliged to leave the meeting when four items which had been discussed already at recent meetings of the City Council - and which I had opposed - were tabled. The new Chairman of CDC's Planning Committee, Stephen Johnson of Harbour Villages Ward, was also compromised when two items relating to the Chidham area were tabled and he had to absent himself briefly from the meeting. The Vice Chair, John Cross of Fiddlewood Ward took his place. Stephen has had to resign from Chidham Parish Council's Planning Committee.

I shall remain on the WGRA Committee though. In the meantime, Vince Waldron, our Treasurer, has agreed to chair the WGRA Committee with the help of other members of the WGRA Committee. We have also invited Jeremy Havard to come onto the committee and would welcome more volunteers - if you are out there and keen to play a part in the life of our street!

Reading volunteers Susie Cooke from Bishop Luffa School has contacted WGRA in the hope that more of our members would be interested in joining their small team of volunteers to lend reading support to students who do not have English as their first language. I attach more information from Susie below so please contact her directly if you feel you would like to help. Thank you.

Susie Cooke (EAL Coordinator) tells us: "Since Spring 2022, nearly 50 Ukrainian students have become part of the Luffa community - or are registered to start at the beginning of next term. We also, of course, have students with refugee status who come from other countries, including Syria for example. In addition, a significant number of other students either do not speak English at home or would benefit from regular reading support because they have specific learning challenges.

"Thanks to our wonderful team of volunteers, our regular reading rota hugely helps some of these students - but we would love to have more support, so that we can help even more young people make the most of their educational opportunities. Each session runs once a week, for half an hour, at either the start or the end of the school day. Please let us know if you would like to get involved - we would be incredibly grateful to have your support!"

Consultation on dog control rules in Chichester District. Chichester District Council (CDC) is reviewing the rules for dogs in public spaces and is asking people to give their views. This is the opportunity for you to have your say on the council's proposals to continue the current Public Space Protection Order for dogs in public spaces until 2026. As part of this order it is currently an offence in public locations such as footpaths and verges, parks, playgrounds and the foreshore to fail to remove dog mess immediately; to not put and keep a dog on a lead when instructed to do so by an authorised officer; and to allow a dog to enter an area from which dogs are excluded. The proposal is to extend the current rules for a further three years and also asks for opinions on whether the ban on dogs in Priory Park and Bishop Palace Gardens should be lifted.
