Financial Report 2020

Dear Members,

You will find our financial statement for 2020 on page 2 of this report; comparison is made to the previous year.

In spite of the Covid 19 situation, our <u>income</u> of £881 was £6 ahead of our record year of 2019, with 70 households paying the £10 annual subscription as opposed to 73 the previous year. This was in spite of the severely reduced number of events to collect contributions from members, due to Government restriction on gatherings of all kinds.

As for the <u>expenditure</u>, the total of £359 was £136 less than the previous year. By far the biggest single item continued to be Public Liability Insurance, which in both years cost us £254. This insurance is required by West Sussex County Council at a liability level of £10 million, enabling certain activities on Westgate (which is a public highway), most notably the maintenance of our street Planters by volunteers, and street parties organised by the 'Beaux Belles' (when we are able to hold them). We are seeking to reduce this high premium through co-operation with other resident associations to get a joint policy.

Net Income this year was therefore £522, an increase of £142 over the previous year.

Thus, and in spite of Covid 19, our funds have continued to increase, from £1921 at the end of 2019 to £2443 at the end of 2020. This increase in funds is very pleasing; as the Whitehouse Farm development continues to advance, we may need to use some of these funds on professional advice to aid our discussions with the Local Authorities and the Developers. More immediately these funds could help us in our our continuing campaign to slow down through-traffic on Westgate (for instance by helping to pay for a speed indicating device) or for other items needed to improve our neighbourhood.

So once again, we would urge you to continue to fund our Association by annual membership fees (which also carry voting rights at AGM). Your Committee proposes that the fees will continue to be £10 per household for the coming year from 1 November 2020 (If you wish to make further donation above the £10, that would also be very welcome). Our preferred method of receiving funds is by electronic payment into our bank account, especially given the continuing health emergency, as follows:
